His administration presided over the introduction of US prohibition, yet Wilson famously loved Scotch, even utilizing a catchy jingle of a 20th century whiskey brand in his presidential campaign — "*Wilson! That's All!*"..

Thomas Woodrow Wilson (December 28, 1856 – February 3, 1924) was an American statesman and academic who served as the 28th President of the United States of America from 1913 to 1921. In 1899 Wilson embarked on a cycling holiday in Ireland. On his journey he spent two nights at the White Horse Hotel in Drogheda. He penned two letters now in the Wilson Archives on White Horse Hotel headed notepaper. A member of the Democratic Party, Wilson served as the President of Princeton University from 1902 to 1910, and as Governor of New Jersey from 1911 to 1913, before winning the 1912 presidential election. As president, he oversaw the passage of progressive legislative policies unparalleled until the New Deal in 1933. He also led the United States during World War I, establishing an activist foreign policy known as "Wilsonianism."
